


GENERAL INFORMATION

2023 KENTUCKY DISTINGUISHED ECONOMIST

Dr. Todd Stinebrickner Professor, Department of Economics University of Western Ontario



Dr. Todd Stinebrickner is a labor economist with a specialization in the area of education. He is the director of the Berea Panel Study. This longitudinal study of students from low-income backgrounds was initiated with the aim of understanding how important decisions are made during college and during the early portion of individuals' post-college lives.

In his research Dr. Stinebrickner tackles a broad range of topics in the field of education and human capital formation as well as other topics in labor economics. He has published extensively in leading journals like the American Economic Review, the Journal of Labor Economics, the Journal of Human Resources, NBER and the Journal of Econometrics.

Dr. Stinebrickner received a B.S. in Mathematics (Summa cum laude) from St. Bonaventure University in 1992, and a M.A. and Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Virginia in 1993 and 1996 respectively. He is now a professor of Economics at the University of Western Ontario and a research associate with the National Bureau of Economic Research and The Institute for Social Research and Population Studies Center at the University of Michigan as well as the Director of The Berea Panel Study.
